Executive

President's Report

In the second (and final) year of my Presidential term, I have the pleasure of presenting to our members the Club's Annual Report for season 2005-2006. The past twelve months have been challenging for the Club, and me, as we continue to grapple with how best to extract the greatest efficiencies from our limited resources, including financial and people constraints.

As custodians of the Club, the Executive is charged with continuing to develop a club culture of caring for our members, where we foster vibrant and contribution-focussed young boys, girls, ladies and men, whom we expect to lead the club through its next developmental phase. In my view, the Club has continued to perform admirably for our members in this area as we strive to meet the myriad of challenges issued on an almost daily basis, whilst being ever-mindful of all our stakeholders, from the broader community, our sponsors, parents of juniors, the City of Yarra, Parks Victoria, Cricket Victoria, supporters, team managers and of course our members themselves.

Our juniors had a very encouraging year, fielding 9 teams from 3 * Under 12s through to Under 17s, with most teams playing finals but ultimately, alas, no premierships. It continues to be absolutely integral to the development of our juniors that new parents to the Club play an active, participative role to assist in managing, umpiring and generally supporting their child's endeavours by being 'present'. I know from personal experience that the rewards are greatest from being actively involved. This is the basis of our Club and a great opportunity to be involved with your kids in sport and to make a broader contribution to your community. A very special thanks to the continuing and outstanding work by Michael Fry and Jenny Webb in particular and all the team coaches and managers. The contributions of Michael and Jenny are not to be under-estimated, who through their organisational skills, demeanour and sheer persistence managed to field nine teams on a weekly basis and achieve an almost perfect subscriptions collection % - par excellence.

Our ladies continued to improve and progressed from their inaugural semi-final appearance in 2004-05 to their inaugural grand final appearance in 2005-06. A tremendous effort by the Ladies, in particular Irene (of course!), Julie, Anna, Sue and Wendy. I know the girls consider their grand final defeat to Gisborne as 'unfinished business' and we look forward to their first-ever premiership in the 2006-07 season.

The senior group comprised five teams for the fourth year in a row, fielding a team in each of the HDCA grades. The senior men were capably and enthusiastically led by a dedicated and hard working leadership group. Some of the senior guys, particularly Julian Delahunt (social, operations), Todd Delahunt (financial, social, operations), Mike Rowe (web-site), Cameron Thatcher (Annual Report, web-site, communications), Brad Shadbolt (cricket operations, set-up), Kristian McCausland (coach, functions, operations) and all Captains (Brad, Andy Olsen, Naresh Pereira, Dave Meiklejohn and Sam Buckley), work hard at the little things around the club that largely go unnoticed and unrewarded. Congratulations to all teams and commiserations to the Twos who almost snatched a win in their semi-final, the Ones and the Fours who missed out on finals by incredibly low margins and the Fives for pushing the grand final to a third match. The Club continues to be served by a cohesive, hard-working executive. Although we continue to grow, it is with some regret that I am compelled to say that without the support of the members, the Club will not continue to prosper and provide the community, based around our wonderful Brunswick Street Oval, with opportunities to be a part of our Club. I plead with all members, and some more particularly than others (i.e., senior men), that their support is welcome and desirable at Club functions and absolutely compulsory in relation to membership subscriptions.

The club's administration will, from 2006-07 onwards be quite different to that of the last decade or so. There will be a social function calendar that will be set in stone and advertised and strictly enforced policies in relation to outstanding memberships for the 2006-07 season (and for those who have not paid in full



for prior years). The Club's current financial position reflects the lack of attendance at functions and non-payment of membership subscriptions.

The Club is progressing some critical issues including the safety, and thus compulsory relocation, of the nets, the re-development of the Alfred Crescent rooms to serve as our 'home' and the Brunswick Street Oval Pavilion re-development.

To those members of the Committee retiring, I wish to thank you for your support and efforts, particularly our tireless Secretary. Each of you is passionate about our Club and has made a significant contribution over the years.

To our major sponsor, the North Fitzroy Arms and our gold and maroon sponsors Automotive Fleet Management, Leveraged Capital and Bosisto's, the club thanks you once again for your support.

The Club's sincere gratitude is extended to all club sponsors, who are listed, along with our major, gold and maroon sponsors, towards the end of the report, along with their logos and contact details.

To all those who support and value the Edinburgh Cricket Club, you know who you are, thank you and I look forward to assisting the Club to continue to achieve, prosper and be recognised in the community as a healthy, strong, all-embracing, enthusiastic and fun Club to be an active participant and member of.

- Brad as Captain of the 1st XI over the past 3 years, we have had a great deal of fun and success. Whilst the ultimate success has not been achieved, the 1st XI has made the finals in two of the last three years and only just missed in the past season.
- Luke Poyser without Luke, it would have been near impossible to organise and operate training – as he continued to deputise for me during the season, he matured into his role.
- Baz the last 3 years have been made all the easier with him to help. It is a long, nearly 4 years as I write this, since a fateful night at the NFA that I agreed to take on the coaching role.

I cannot think of a more challenging and rewarding role than Coaching ECC over the past three seasons and I am sure that the Club is in a far stronger position, in terms of playing personnel, than it was when I arrived.



Membership

Our membership has grown steadily over the past few seasons. This season we plateau'd and membership numbers remained just in excess of the 200 mark, set last season.

We rely heavily on membership revenue to cover approximately 95% of our operating costs, which includes player insurance, ground fees, affiliation fees, umpiring, coaching, balls and equipment. However we are finding it difficult to collect membership fees. This year our collection of fees was up compared to previous years, largely thanks to the juniors outstanding collection %, however there is room for improvement, particularly the senior men.

Non payment of membership fees severely restricts the clubs ability to operate and provide the services and facilities that other clubs are able to offer.

Our first Duchess of Edinburgh!



It was great to gain new players to the club, such as Luke Poyser, Jono Maher, Paul Jacobs and gain Gus Lightowlers for a full year. Losses from the 2004-05 list were Stuart Low, Jase Wilkins & Marcus Abbott, but this has to be expected.

For the first team in a few years, the core of the group missed games, though with the depth at the club, we should have been able to cover it. I thank Rhys Cahill & Kristian for stepping in for me while away.

It was good to see Jono Coyne, Ted Sussex, Sean Edwards, Jarrod Ziemer & Ben Calder step up to the 1st XI, with the last three of them making their debuts.

Two players who really matured this year in my eyes were Bob Neilson & Ben Crockford. Bob's bowling was by far the best I have seen it & he has rediscovered his batting ability. Ben simply started to realise how good he is when he concentrates. His hundred against East Ivanhoe was simply the best innings I have ever seen. Hopefully these two will take their form & belief into 2006-07.

Again Rob Simpson bowled as he does, well without luck and I hope he keeps going. He deserves more. Rhys Cahill, Kristian McCausland, Matt Green & Brendan Pateman all made solid contributions through out the year. BP is a classic Edinburgh player. More talent than most people I know, which we saw on a few occasions, though I hope he decides to take the next step & dominate as he could.

Some of the standout individual performances included:-

- Nick Abbott 130 against West Ivanhoe.
- Ben Crockford's 110 against East Ivanhoe
- Brendan Pateman 109 after tea against East Ivanhoe
- The team total of 390 against East Ivanhoe.
- Brad Low 7/25, including a hat-trick, against Banyule.
- Jono Maher 5/39 against West Heldelberg
- Luke Poyser carrying his bat against Heidelberg

The individuals who again were out overall best performers included: -



- Nick Abbott: 439 runs at the top of the order. Again represented the HDCA and continues to be a class performer.
- Luke Poyser: 239 runs and 18-dismmisal behind the stumps. A very valuable addition to the club, who will just get better.
- Julian Delahunt: again our leading wicket taker with 19.
- Brad Low: 16-wickets, 189 runs and fantastic fielding ability both in the slip cordon & infield/outfield.

Congratulation to Rhys Cahill and partner Allison on the birth of their beautiful young daughter, Lucy Jagger Cahill. I hope dad is allowed to come back & make a few runs next year. He was sorely missed.

Again I must thank Barry Calnon, Todd Delahunt, Julian Delahunt, Irene Bullock & Nick Abbott for there support & work around the club. Without these people the club simply would not exist.

Interesting times lay ahead for the club. I really think that until the off field issues such as the Brunswick Street Oval & Alfred Crescent Pavilions upgrades, Brunswick Street Oval cricket nets upgrade, collection of 100% membership (people/teams not using the club as a free ride), increased & servicing sponsors, canteen/bar productivity, club functions breaking even, successful application for available grants, finding a new senior club coach, increased merchandise sales & deciding whether we field 4 or 5 teams, are all tackled by an active Club Executive, then we really can not expect the club to be successful on the field. Being well run & successful off the field, will lead to the success we all desire.

As I see it, the club is run by too few. I ask anybody who wishes to be involved, to get involved. And when you say you will be involved, actually do so.

Lastly, I would like to announce that I have stepped from the captaincy of the 1st XI at ECC. It has been a great honour, easily my proudest achievement in cricket. However I think it is time for a new message and perspective for the team.

To me it is obvious that for the 1st XI to make the finals and compete to win a premiership, the leadership from the top two leaders has to be better. I don't think I am out of school announcing that Nick Abbott will take over the captaincy. I wish Nick every success and I am absolutely positive he is the right man for the iob.

Thanks again, to all the players, who have now had to put up with my antics for 4 years, I have thoroughly enjoyed it and hope to be apart of the club's success for many years to come.

Second XI Report

2005-06 overflowed with positives and the Burras took a huge leap forward in second grade. Continuing on from last season's late (but unsuccessful) charge towards the finals we finished in fourth spot, narrowly missing out in the Semi Final against the eventual premiers Viewbank.

We began brilliantly with a comprehensive 7 wicket demolition of Rosanna (at Rosanna) which set the scene for the season. 10 wins and a draw from 15 games was a fantastic return by all 27 players who represented the 2s. We were the 2nd best 2-day team, 6 wins and a draw from 8 games – the loss and draw against the Premiers. There will be a stronger focus on one-day games next season.

Our bowling, as always, was our greatest strength, taking more wickets than any other team in the comp. Aiding this was a fantastic improvement in our fielding. Apart from that one horror game against Bellfield where we dropped everything, we caught just about anything that was dished up. The batting was solid – topping the 200 mark four times versus once last year. The semi final wasn't the greatest time to collapse in the batting department but we'll learn and next year go one better.

Another key to our improvement was good old fashioned bribery. Yes, four matches throughout the season were designated "slab games" meaning the skipper shouted the first post-match slab in return for a victory. The bank balance took a pounding in three of the four, with the treasurer offering no bulk discounts behind the bar. Who knows what depths I'll stoop to next season...

Of course, the team success is born out of the individuals who make it up and no report is complete without a player wrap...

In the bowling department, Eamon "Moscow" Drew was again my "go to" man, even though I'm not sure you have "go to" men in cricket – he was *that* good. Mixing wicket-taking jaffas with putrid jokes, he finished the year with 28 wickets @ 12 (with 2 five wicket hauls) and pocketed the Competition Bowling trophy as well.

Shaun Edwards led the way with the bat (275 runs @ 46) holding down the number three

spot and consistently building the foundation for large totals. I appreciated his cricket wisdom (as opposed to Olsen, Drew and Calnon's blind optimism) and third place in the Don Richmond Trophy for the Competition's best second grade player was a fantastic achievement.

The re-emergence of Barry "The Postman" Calnon as a swash-buckling top order batsman and a reliable keeper played a key role in our fortunes. With up to four keepers in the side at any one time, the pressure was on but Baz did not, I repeat did not, drop a thing. As usual, his support from a captaincy point of view was invaluable and I thank him for not getting reported.

Back in bowling land, Moscow was ably assisted by the pace and bounce (and lower order slog) of Hamish McLean, a great effort in a tough year personally. George Rodman had a great debut season – the only sour note came when detained for terrorist activities. Yes, young George terrorized Heidelberg West, picking up 2 for 1 from 8 overs, spoiling his figures with a leg-side wide. I apologise now for that lame combination of cricket report and political commentary.

Dan "Doc" Nicholls proved he was well and truly up to second grade level with an outstanding first-up season. Last season Dan played fourths but skipped Naresh's mob to bowl consistently and provide some lower order (and occasional opening) help with the bat.

Marcus "Mooks" Lorkin somehow turned himself into an all-rounder in 2005/06. He batted well under pressure in the semi-final and bowled a nagging length that looked as though it should have been spanked but, at less than 2 runs per over, it most certainly wasn't. I'm looking for him to take charge of the middle order next year and build on a great start.

Ben Crockford and Jono Coyne are first grade quality but we always appreciate their contributions to the 2s. Benny's glorious 74 against Rosanna was a highlight and Jono was unlucky to be dismissed in the semi after top scoring and looking comfortable.

Rowan "Viv" Wilson had an excellent deput season, grabbing the opportunity to open the innings and ensuring solid starts. However, he struggled with "Operation Silence", a cunning plan to distract the batsman with complete quiet. Two balls had passed before Viv began yapping to himself. "Operation Silence" – RIP.

Nick "Junior" Callanan showed glimpses of brilliance throughout the season but next year I'll be looking for a more consistent role with increased responsibility. I'll also be looking for someone to work on his jokes, especially at Trivia Nights. That man won't be Mick Younger who stepped into the 2s and performed well with limited opportunities. When he had the chance he took them, snaring wickets in all but 1 game and sledging bowlers after hooking them for 4.

As if having the president in the side wasn't pressure enough, I was also lucky enough to have the coach, Kristian McCausland. KM was solid with the bat but dynamic in the field. Catches, direct hit run out – there was nothing he couldn't do. Except maybe beat the catch of the season taken by Benny Calder. A running, diving outfield catch against Viewbank was a season highlight. Ben bowled beautifully and thoroughly deserved his promotion to the 1s.

The two best innings of the season came from Jarrod Ziemer and Chris Horsley-Wyatt. Jaz was thrown into the opening spot against Greensborough at a ground the firsts or seconds had not won at in the 2000s. Despite the heat Jaz batted his guts out, guiding us to victory with a match winning 43* - an amazing win with a coaching master class on the cut shot thrown in for good measure. Jaz was also a dynamo with the ball, taking 2/8 in the semi final to rocket us back into contention. Against the second placed Banvule, the Burras had collapsed from 2/103 to 7/131 when CHW ambled to the crease. With 150 looking out of reach, he compiled a very mature innings of 47*, taking us to a season high 218 and a brilliant victory.

As always, there were cameos -

- Marcus Abbott's 4/8 to destroy Rosanna in Round 1
- Bobbler Nielson's 3/25 from 25 overs
- Prashan Arumagam dismissing the best batsman in the league, inspiring an Agrade tanti
- Matty Green's 7 wickets in 2 games and bewilderment at the "shoe game" concept

It was a case of Groundhog Day again for the 4ths, losing the final match of the season and consequently being edged out of the finals on percentage. Before that the team performed strongly all season.

We made a good start with a win over long time rivals, Banyule, in the opener at Alfred Crescent. Dave Mallen led the way with four wickets and Andy Kemp got rid of the dangerous Kernaghan cheaply, as the visitors were bundled out for 136. Tony Zaccardi (71 not out) and Kemp (50) shared fifth wicket partnership of 121 and we won by five wickets.

The next game against Old Ivanhoe was a washout though they managed to rattle up 246 in difficult bowling conditions at Chelsworth Park. Edinburgh was on target with 0-23 in reply before the rain put an end to proceedings.

The next weekend saw a one-day outright win for Edinburgh against a weakened Viewbank. At Alfred Crescent, we bowled the visitors out for just 23, Meiklejohn taking five wickets. Steve Draffin (38 not out), Kemp 41 and John Wooles (23 not out) then belted a quick reply of 1 for 130 by tea. We declared and sent Viewbank in again, dismissing them for 87 in the second innings, Meiklejohn taking 6 for 27.

A long tail caused us problems in the next game against eventual premiers, Greensborough Green. Having restricted them to 9 for 137 with three wickets apiece to Andrew George and Ned Hurley, Edinburgh collapsed to 106 all out.

We got back on track in a thriller the next week against West Ivanhoe. Having bowled them out for 149 (four wickets to Kemp), we started well with a 75 run opening partnership between Draffin (28) and Tom Ryan (55) which included the rare highlight of a Steve Draffin six. The middle order stumbled before Simon Jackson saw us home with a cool 26 not out including 14 off the last over, as we won by four wickets.

Against Greensborough White, we just missed out on another outright in a match in which we lost Simon Jackson with a broken hand received when fielding. Having bowled the opposition out for 130, we were 1 for 61 in reply at the close. We soon passed their score thanks to an Andy Kemp 52 not out and added another 16 before declaring. Despite having

them in early trouble at 5 for 40, their latter order batsmen hung around enough to play out the time, bowled out for 107 with not enough overs to get the outright.

The last match before Christmas was away at Banyule. Despite three wicket hauls for Jonathon Mills and George, they scored 222. In reply we could only manage 188, the highlight being Peter Shadbolt's 47.

After the New Year, we played Greensborough White and scored 6 for 213 at home, with Draffin scoring 59 and Zaccardi 47 not out. We then bowled them out for 166, Andy Kemp taking 4 for 25.

At home the follo9wing week against Greensborough Green, we let ourselves down with some poor batting to be dismissed in the first innings for just 112, Paul Bolton scoring 27 before injuring his Achilles tendon and being out for the season. Greensborough Green passed the score with three wickets down.

The bad run continued in the next match against the dangerous Old Ivanhoe as we were held to 7 for 152, Meiklejohn top scoring with 46, supported by Ron Pennefather with 30 and Jackson with 21 not out. Dave Lee bowled well to pick up three wickets but it wasn't enough as we lost by 2 wickets.

We got back on track with a win in the next match out at Rosanna, dismissing them for 206 on a big ground, Cal Green taking his first five-wicket haul in senior cricket with 5-29. It was a hard slog in reply, but good scores from Wooles (63), Shadbolt (59) and Pennefather with 47, saw us home.

The final game was a straight playoff for the last finals spot against Heidelberg West. In a match shortened by rain, we kept them to 9 for 182, two wickets each to Mills, Kemp and George amid a rash of dropped catches. Despite innings of 36 from Draffin, 34 from Wooles, 29 from Zaccardi and 23 from Shadbolt, we never scored fast enough and fell short, ending up 7 for 152.





Finance & Marketing

Treasurer's Report

The club recorded a poor financial result for the 2005-06 year, depleting cash reserves by more than \$4,200, thereby reversing a significant portion of the favourable cash result from the previous financial year.

Our revenues were down on the previous year, largely because of the significant unpaid membership fees of the senior men and poor attendance at Club functions.

The trading deficit depleted cash reserves to just over \$13,500, although there are some mitigating circumstances including:

- the Club's \$1,000 Investment in Clifroy Limited, whereby we are a shareholder of the Bendigo Bank Community Branch on Queen's Parade:
- improvements were made to the Alfred Crescent pavilion including laying carpet, acquiring chairs and tables, professional sponsor boards and sundry kitchen shelving and utensils:
- to-date, four monthly payments to a consultant, at \$1,100 a month, to assist the Club with securing sponsorship, applying for grants and liaison with council to expedite the relocation and reconstruction of the dangerous nets and a complete re-build of the Alfred Crescent Pavilion, pending progress on the Brunswick Street Pavilion. This consultant's contract was signed for 6 months, effective from 2 March 2006.

We continued to invest in the future by equipping our junior section with appropriate safety equipment, coaching and support staff. Detailed below are some key events and categories that have contributed to the current financial position of the club.

Sponsorship

Major Sponsor

The Club's continuing major sponsor, the North Fitzroy Arms, contributed a substantial \$2,500 this year and this is, as always, highly valued and absolutely appreciated. I know we will all continue to support our major sponsor throughout the off-season and again in 2006-

07. The Club thanks Michael Reardon and Andy McDonough for continuing to provide us great hospitality. The Thursday night crayfish raffles are an additional, significant source of revenue for the Club, netting on average almost \$1,000 per annum over the last three years.

Gold and Maroon Sponsors

For the third year, Automotive Fleet Management contributed the significant sum of \$1,500 and Leveraged Capital matched this financial commitment for the second consecutive year. Again, their contribution is appreciated and we all need to remain cognisant in providing our sponsors with our support when sourcing motor vehicles and seeking financial, investment and share-market advice.

Our Juniors excelled themselves in relation to membership collection this season, with \$13,400 (2004-05 \$9,900) and the patience and persistence of Jenny Webb in particular on collections was fundamental to the fantastic collection pattern. Our Women were also excellent, collecting \$1,155 this season (2004-05 \$1,020) and approaching 90% collection, a great effort. The senior men noticeably let the club down, with their collection % at just on 70% that is simply unacceptable and must be improved upon immediately.

Annual Dinner

The Annual Dinner at Princes Park in November was a pleasant evening where more than 62 (2004-05: more than 75 guests) members, past players and guests enjoyed our Jim Higgs recollecting his past as an Australian Test cricketer of some renown. Unfortunately, for the first time ever, the Club's margin was (somewhat) less \$1,000 and it appears better and more frequent publicity, a new venue and a



revitalised format is necessary to attract our membership base.

Presentation Nights

The junior and senior presentation nights were both enjoyable evenings, although the attendance for the senior presentation night was extremely disappointing, meaning a significant loss was incurred.

Grants

The cycle and timing of grants meant our focus was not where it should have been in relation to grants this year and we need to ensure this becomes a critical focus for the incoming Executive.

Other Functions

The Trivia Night in December and the Reverse Raffle at the end-of-season Function were both good nights and financially successful.

Insurance

For the third year, we joined the Cricket Australia-advocated insurance program. The premiums were reasonably constant from the prior year, although we all need to be aware that the policy does not fully cover all costs associated with injury. The 'gap' after private health, medicare and the club's insurance in two separate claims made during the previous season, was between \$500 and \$1,000. We simply all need to be mindful of this, particularly all players and their parent's.

Coaching

Our coaching expenses, including net hire, clinics and cricket camps was again a substantial investment that really represents the club's commitment to the future, represented by Luke Poyser taking on the 'junior' Under 12 team.

Cricket Expenses


The major expenses in running a cricket club remain balls, equipment, umpires and ground hire fees, all of which rose again this year. These are all evident in the financial report provided below.

Conclusion

The Club has taken a step backwards financially and although some of the cash deficit can be considered as an investment (Improvements to Alfred Crescent Pavilion, Consultant's Fees, Coaching Fees, Shares in Clifroy Limited), the Club can not afford to be complacent.

The key areas to focus on over the next twelve months include drastic improvement on membership collection rates (for the senior men), promoting and selling our merchandise stocks to the entire club, taking appropriate care of Club equipment (so that new kits are not acquired every season), participation in club social events and supporting our wonderful sponsors.


