

A LOOK BACK AT SEASON 2009-2010

The past season saw continuing consolidation of the junior section of the Club. The Edinburgh CC wants the juniors to be *an integral* part of the club and for players and parents to feel this. The aim is that the junior players develop their cricketing skills and play their games in an enjoyable and safe environment with the emphasis on inclusion especially in the younger age groups; the Club motto being 'Cricket is fun'

The Club has continued to develop its policy that there must be a clear *pathway* through juniors and, as they get older, through to seniors. That is, there is a progressive and planned development of personal and team skills that enable juniors to transit smoothly through each successive junior level and, from there, to senior cricket. The MILO programme, which is the start of the *pathway*, retained its Saturday morning time slot, but there was a change in location from Alfred Crescent to the main Brunswick St Oval. A twelve week programme was offered and attracted the maximum of 35 youngsters.

The number of junior teams competing in the HDCA competition increased to eight. For the first time for a number of years, the Club fielded two teams in the Under 11 Development (Kookaburra) competition. There were three teams in Under 13 (two in Green division, one in Gold), one in the Under 15 and two in Under 17 (one in Green division and one in Gold). We nominated our one Under 15 team for the Green Division. However, because of a lack of teams in the Under 15 HDCA competition, our team was placed in the older Gold Division which presented a rather daunting challenge. Initially we had 18 players registered in the Under 17 competition; too many for one team but two few for two teams. However, as a result of a recruitment drive amongst friends, we were able to field two teams. The numbers in all teams at Under 11 and Under 13 levels were capped at numbers the Club could fully support. This season the Club also competed in the Under 17 T20 Big Bash HDCA competition with a team largely consisting of those players eligible to play next season. The team put up a good performance which harbingers well for next season.

Generally, all the teams steadily improved during the year, with the best results coming at the end of the season. More detailed team reports and individual achievements are highlighted in the reports that follow. At the start of the last game, three teams were in a position to make it into the finals, however only the Under 13 Maroon team did. They went on to defeat Banyule in a closely contested semi-final and met East Ivanhoe in the Grand Final. The team was in with a chance of winning the Grand Final when they restricted the undefeated East Ivanhoe team to a little over 200 on the first morning. However, tight bowling and fielding by their opponents plus a sodden ground due to Melbourne's worst storm in forty years put the total beyond their reach. Well done team.

Coaching was conducted by a pool of accredited coaches drawn from the senior players and junior parents and the coaches were supported by parental team managers. Junior training at Edinburgh is conducted in age groups on set days rather than on an ad-hoc team-by-team basis. This policy allows the junior players access to a greater range of coaches and thus, skills. Training age-groups together is also aimed both at building greater connections between the different teams and also fostering a sense of belonging to a club as well as a team. Arrangements were made with the Club's senior coaching group to give the Under 15s and Under 17s the opportunity to train with seniors if they wished.

Attention continued to be given to the end of the *pathway*, namely the transition of juniors into seniors. A planned mentoring and coaching system was initiated. It began with the Winter Development Programme which enabled 18 juniors, mainly from the U17 and U15 groups, to attend specialist coaching at Shaun Browns Cricket Academy. Of these, 10 went onto play senior cricket this season and were joined by 5 additional juniors, mainly from the Under 15 team, making a total of 15 of our current juniors who played senior cricket this season. The Club will consolidate the Winter Development Programme and further develop the mentoring and coaching schemes in the coming season.



This season also saw the Club providing the opportunity for children who have little exposure to cricket to be introduced to the game. This was done through a City of Yarra Community Grant which enabled the Club to run a successful 12 week cricket programme for children in the Atherton Gardens high rises which concluded with a Gala match in mid-December at BSO immediately before a senior T20 match. The Club had assistance from Cricket Victoria, from the Yarra Youth Resource Officers at Fitzroy Police and from students from the Catholic University.

Off the field, the Junior Working Group held three meetings over the season. The purpose of these meetings is to give junior management, coaches, managers and parents the opportunity to meet to review, discuss and advise the Club executive on the junior programme. The last of these for this season will review our junior cricket operations and marks the beginning of preparations for next season.

The club also asked the teams to organise food for a communal tea break this season, not only to make sure all the hungry players were sustained but also to foster a greater sense of team spirit both amongst the players and parents. The team managers put in a lot of work and did a fantastic job with their respective food rosters and the variety of teas was very impressive! The club will definitely be continuing this policy in future seasons.

In looking back at the season, special thanks are due to the Club's Director of Cricket, Naresh Pereira, for his constant help behind the scenes. He and Stuart Whiley are thanked for their assistance with the Winter Programme and Stuart for his mentoring of the juniors who played and trained with the seniors. The support and assistance they, and the captains of our senior teams, gave to juniors playing senior cricket is much appreciated.

On behalf of the Club, I thank the following – The staff at Cricket Victoria, especially John Watkin, David Hall, Andy Lee and Sebastian Kipman for their interest and advice throughout the season; particularly with the Atherton Gardens Project; the Yarra Resource Officers, Tony Brewin and Chris McGeaghan; the students from the CU and senior players Dan Nicholls, Jack Faine, Robbie Kerr and Johnny Warnock for their input and assistance in making the Atherton Gardens Project so successful. Thanks are also given to Richmond Cricket Club for giving junior players the opportunity to participate in their Development Programme.

A big thank you to the following people: Senior players—Brendan Barron, Brendan Bolton, Dave Mallen, Ted Sussex and Tom Witherden for coaching individual teams along with junior parents—Richard Blanch and Mick Symons who also coached teams. To Arthur Watkin and Jason Sutton for their role as training coaches. To the parents who took on the role of team manager—Dean Campbell, Steve Graham, Deb Keir, Tim O'Meara, Dean Robinson, Carolyn Wilson and Simon Wilson. To MILO & junior parent, Glenn Henry and MILO parent & senior player, James Bradley for organising and coaching our MILO programme and MILO parent Maureen Vincent and her fantastic crew for the weekly MILO sausage sizzle.

Also thank you to those parents who, throughout the season, provided transport to and sustenance at matches. A special thank you to Jenny Cocks for preventing tonnes of soil being dumped on Alfred Crescent prior to a game. Thank you to CalciYum, our junior sponsor, for their help in promoting grass roots cricket in the North Fitzroy area and to the City of Yarra for their support of the Atherton Gardens Project.

Finally, thank you to the Club President, Andy Olsen, Junior Committee representative, John Wilson, and to all on the Club Executive and Committee and to the Head Coach, Chris Brannigan, for the support they have given junior cricket over the past season. Their help has provided a strong foundation for success in the season 2010 -2011.

Josh Bradley has had a great season, his cricket has improved enormously. Josh has worked hard on his batting and is starting to work the ball around and score runs easily, including a fabulous leg glance for 4 runs in our last game of the season.

Harry Fear is a very gifted batsmen and has worked hard on his shot selection. His bowling has been fast, full and accurate, challenging many batsmen. Harry has also demonstrated great natural ability in the field and is amongst our top fieldsmen and a superb wicket keeper.

James Fear is a very talented and aggressive batsmen and has often top scored for our team. James hit 10 fours for the season, with a highest score of 15, including 3 fours. James bowls fast and swings the ball, troubling many batsmen. James is a very tidy wicket keeper and an excellent fieldsman.

Gus Galloway, like his team mates has been an extremely rewarding player to coach. He listens carefully and continually tries to improve his game. Gus is developing into a great batsman, strong in defence and he has an awesome hook shot. Gus' top score for the season is 14 not out.

Matthew O'Meara works extremely hard in the field and is one of our great all-rounders. He bats with confidence, his cover drives are the sign of a talented batsman and he has been one of our highest run scorers for the season. Matthew's swing bowling is fabulous, conceding less than 2 runs per over for the season and equal best bowling figures of 2/7.

Charlie Robert has not only been a delight to coach he has developed into an extremely good all rounder this season. Charlie bats extremely well, rarely loses his wicket and has a highest score of 8 not out. Charlie is also one of our fastest and most accurate bowlers, rarely bowling a bad ball.

Doug Warren has had an outstanding first season of cricket, his achievements have included: top run scorer for the team; highest batting average; and a top score of 15 not out. Doug's fielding has been excellent with 3 catches and saving many runs. He has also bowled superbly often conceding less than 1 run per over.

It was a year of firsts for the Edinburgh Cricket Club Under 13's Maroon. Certainly the most exciting match of the home and away season for me, the players and I'm sure for the parents and supporters there to watch was the game against West Ivanhoe.

After struggling early some very good middle order batting in particular from Jack Taylor (37 N.O) helped get us towards a good first innings total. This was followed by some lusty late order hitting from Tom Shute, Ben Le Mesurier and Josh Broderick who all managed to hit the first boundaries of their careers to help us to 189. West Ivanhoe found themselves 9/157 before a solid last wicket partnership had everyone on the edges of their seat. After casting around to find the perfect bowler for the situation the ball landed in Josh Broderick's hands, who responded with the score on 9/187 with a Yorker length delivery that bowled the batsmen created an instant hero and gave the boys their second win and their first in a truly tight and testing contest.

In Round 4 we ventured to Banyule Flats to play Viewbank, on a wet afternoon we bowled sensationally well with Sean Brickhill the pick of the bowlers taking 2 for 4, to bowl Viewbank out for 94. We had a short 12 over period to navigate with the bat. The Viewbank boys were fired up and ensured it was very difficult for our boys. Some sledging generally unheard of at this level got to our boys and we struggled to 3-12 over night. The next week some fine batting from a number of the boys but in particular Josh Robinson really steadied the ship and helped lead us to a fantastic win.

Round 5 against Rosanna resulted in another win for the team, once again comfortable, victorious by 68 runs. This match however was memorable for one innings in particular. At the start of the season as coach I took the decision that as we had fifteen players, I would retire batsmen after 10 to 12 over's to ensure that every player had a chance to bat. As a result of this high individual scores were always going to be difficult to achieve. However, in this game after 10 over's Jack Bradley had raced to high 30's and I felt that he was deserving of the chance to go on and get the big 50. Thankfully he batted splendidly and repaid the faith with a fantastic innings. It was great to see the enjoyment that not only Jack but all of the team got from an individual's performance. This team emphasis is essential in a successful team and if maintained and built upon will ensure this team continues to be successful into the future.

These games made up the most important and memorable of the home and away season however they were only a lead up to the finals. A sensational training session during the week led into the game well and bowling first gave the team the chance to settle their nerves. A sensational team bowling performance saw excellent spells from a lot of bowlers. Of particular note was the performance of Max Howard who took 1 for 6 and bowled very well. Edinburgh restricted Banyule to 134 giving us a great chance of chasing down the runs. The batting performance was especially pleasing because of the players who contributed to the run chase. Both Lucien Finch and Bardo Imber-Dixon batted very well and including some great running between the wickets, a real focus during the week at training, to get us over the line despite some nervous moments towards the end. It was great to see that the team took on this advice and attacked the game with great enthusiasm and little nerves. The boys bowled well against a very good team, of particular note was Dan Le Mesurier's 4 over's 1 maiden 1 for 22, however East Ivanhoe still compiled 214. This was always going to be a tough ask and the boys were encouraged to just go out and enjoy their batting on day two. Early wickets and tight bowling made it very difficult for the team to score and we finished on 93. Despite this it was great to hear the boys be very positive about their season in the aftermath of the game, there is no doubt that next year the team will be even better and are poised to go all the way.

The season also saw a number of personal achievements that should be noted as they were important beyond the significance of individual games. This year saw first career wickets for a number of players including Tom Catoggio, David Jaques and Max Gray all of whom followed this up with sustained improvement and excellent performances throughout the season. Max became a very valuable opening batsman to the team in the second half of the season consistently providing a solid base for the team to build on. Anthony Estephan was a steady contributor with the ball, bowling tightly and often shaping the ball nicely toward slips. With his batting he placed the ball purposefully against Rosanna during his 17 no. Anthony also played one game with the under 15 team.

David Fogarty batted with great resolve against the top team, holding our innings together as he accumulated our top score of 22 out of 91. He finished third in the batting reaching 65 runs. His off spinners showed good potential, keeping batsmen guessing with some deceptive flight.

Max Gust bowled with good accuracy through the year, moving the ball both ways off the pitch, ending up with 3 wickets. He batted safely, with a good defence, particularly when up the order against East Ivanhoe Saints.

Aki Hatz showed good early form with the bat scoring a career high of 20 (including 5 boundaries) followed by a 10 and 12. His bowling regularly yielded wickets – he nabbed four for the season including best ever figures of 1 for 4.

Declan Himmelreich-Beaumont developed his batting terrifically this year with the highlight being his career top score of 26 against West Ivanhoe (the highest individual score for the team). His lofted drive over cover for four still lingers in the memory. He just missed a batting trophy making 63 runs. With the ball, Declan took two wickets.

Harry Hopkins started the season slowly but then worked hard on his game. His bowling became much more consistent and economical, and he placed a real value on his wicket ending the season with a career top score of 10 no against the top team, Banyule.

Matt Thomas had a good year with the bat making double figures three times with a top score of 14, and a final total of 60 runs – just outside the batting trophies. His bowling was very reliable, giving opposition batsmen a consistent line outside off stump. Matthew fielded well grabbing six catches and four run outs.

Nick White played an effective role with the bat, reaching double figures four times with a top score of 19 no made with the Under 15 team. With the ball Nick ripped his leggies to great effect taking 7 wickets including his best ever figures of 3 for 2.

Jesse Wilson's bowling really improved this year. He bowled quickly and accurately which meant most teams didn't try to score off him. He saved his best for the last game getting 2 for 5, his best ever figures. Once settled, Jesse's batting showed a good range of shots. His top score was 13.

Summary

By the end of the season players were concentrating much better throughout the 45 overs, looking to score singles, calling loudly each ball, attacking the ball when fielding and backing up throws from the outfield which culminated in 5 run outs in our last game. They looked and played much more like budding cricketers.

I have thoroughly enjoyed coaching the boys this season and look forward to building on their camaraderie and strong team spirit which will prepare them well for 2010-11.
